







Nearly 900 families have been served since our inception in 1985

Since 1985, nearly \$1.5 million has been paid in property taxes to local communities by our homeowners

Approximately, \$10 million in total Affordable Home Mortgage Loans have been made since 1985 for Habitat homes

Since 2017, over 220 families have been served through our Acts of Kindness Program that offers low-income homeowners with basic home beautification, repair, and improvements

Home Inspection Program has helped some 300 low-income homeowners get the necessary repairs needed to keep their homes safe and in tip-top shape

22,000 hours of volunteer labor is provided annually, translating into over \$320,000 of investment in our programs

ReStore sells some 35,000 items monthly, the proceeds of which help us build more homes in the valley

6,500 stakeholders are communicated with monthly

At any time, 15 NeW homes are under various stages of construction

Through our workforce development program, we have served 350 individuals translating into over 4.250 hours of job training



a dream realized; Meet the Johnson Family!

Over the last 34 years, we've had the good fortune of improving housing conditions for nearly 800 families through our "helping hands" approach that provides valuable support, home and neighborhood enhancements, and new home construction for those who need it the most.

One such example is our newest homeowner family, Chelsi and Stephen Johnson. Theirs is a story of perseverance and faith in God's love. Over the past few years, they have faced many challenges and suffered the loss of two cherished family members. leaving the family to wonder when the tide of sadness and grief would pass.



Through all of this, the thought of affordable homeownership seemed completely out of reach, but God had something else in mind for the family.

In the summer of 2018, the Johnson family received the life-changing news that they were selected for a Habitat home and began construction the very next day!

Chelsi said it best herself, "It's going to mean a future, a bright one. It's going to mean everything for our kids and our future kids." She summarized, "It means more than anything." Owning a home had been a dream for the Johnson family for as long as they can remember.

By Christmas, the Johnsons had invested well over the 500 volunteer hours of "Sweat Equity" required of each family. The hours were well spent, and they enjoyed working alongside fellow volunteers and helping other Habitat families build their homes.

"It's been a lot of work, but it's been worth it," Chelsea said. Looking ahead to their future home, she added, "Our children will have a safe place to play, they'll be able to run out in the backyard and just enjoy having space and a place for summertime barbeques!"

Meanwhile, Chelsi regularly gives back to our community by being a strong Habitat advocate. She has shared her story about Habitat and the difference it has made for her family at a host of community events. Each time, she expresses her gratitude to Habitat and what a blessing this work truly is.

The Johnson Family's homeownership surprise.







For many families, the thought of buying a home can seem impossible. Habitat for Humanity helps ready families for the responsibility of homeownership and what it means financially.

We partner with hard-working, low-income families that are unable to escape their current living conditions and acquire a mortgage through traditional means. Many of the families we serve live in deplorable housing situations that include overcrowding, lack of heating or cooling, leaky roofs, uncontrollable mold growth, broken plumbing, and other structural deficiencies. No families should ever live in those conditions in our community.

We provide families with the opportunity to buy their own home, which provides a foundation for life. A home changes a family's trajectory immediately and for generations.

Our homes are not given away. We give the families we serve a "hand up" not a "hand out."

Our homeownership process carefully identifies vulnerable families and restores their sense of pride and accomplishment. Applicants must have

a demonstrated need, and a minimum credit score of 620. Habitat's homebuyers must put in 500 hours of Sweat Equity by assisting in the building of their own home.

their neighbors' home, or in our ReStore retail outlets. Through down payment assistance and low market rate home loans from our financial partners, we offer buyers affordable mortgages that are often lower than their current rent. As a result, the dream of homeownership becomes attainable.



of Fresno and Madera Counties' residents are "rent burdened;" they are spending an extremely high percentage of their gross income on housing-related costs. This leaves minimal funds for clothing, food, and other necessities designed to help a family move forward and leave poverty behind.

neighborhood revitalization

Residents of a community know their hopes and dreams for their neighborhood — complete communities with safe and walkable streets, decent and affordable homes, and an equal opportunity to thrive and add value to their community.

Neighborhood Revitalization goes beyond connecting residents and neighborhoods to available resources. We know true success lies in creating partnerships for and with the communities who are ready to take charge of improving their neighborhoods. Residents and neighborhoods that have the support of others are more likely to feel empowered and able to realize their full potential.



We are reinvigorating neighborhoods and individuals' lives by:

- Offering vulnerable families and individuals an assortment of home preservation programs designed to address critical to minor home repairs
- Extending a helping hand to older adults through our Aging in Place program
- Simple Acts of Kindness to aid in basic home or apartment beautification projects
- Enabling individuals to enjoy their homes by offering accessibility options like ramps or handrails for stable mobility
- This program is of great value to individuals with limited mobility including disabled veterans
